Lesson: **Strong's Concordance review**

3850 parabolé (from 3844 /pará, "close beside, with" and 906 /bállō, "to cast") – a parable; a teaching aid cast alongside the truth being taught. This casts additional light by using an arresting or familiar analogy, (which is often fictitious or metaphorical, but not necessarily).

Thayer's Greek Lexicon

STRONGS NT 3850: παραβολή

παραβολή, παραβολῆς, ἡ (παραβάλλω, which see), the Sept. for ;לִּשְׁוֹן

1. **a placing of one thing by the side of another, juxtaposition, as of ships in battle**, Polybius 15, 2, 13; Diodorus 14, 60.

2. metaphorically, a comparing, comparison of one thing with another, likeness, similitude

What does it mean to **cast**?

to throw or move (something) in a forceful way

: to throw (a fishing line, hook, etc.) into the water by using a fishing pole

: to send or direct (something) in the direction of someone or something
